1. BACKGROUND

CPDI has always been scrutinizing budget documents from different angles and releasing a number of research reports which are directly related to the solution of public problems. Purpose of these reports is to inform the public as to what percentage of the amount of their tax money is used to fulfill their basic needs and how much importance is given to their basic issues during federal and provincial budgeting.

CPDI aims to develop a comprehensive Information Kit to provide an easy and in-depth understanding of the budget making process in developed democracies and Pakistan. The kit would serve as an educational resource for policymakers, government officials, researchers, and the general public to understand budgetary processes in developed democracies.

2. SCOPE OF INFORMATION KIT

The Information Kit may cover the following key areas:

- Overview of the budget making process in developed democracies.
- Roles and responsibilities of government bodies and agencies involved in the budget process.
- Stages of the budget cycle, including formulation, approval, execution, monitoring, revision, and evaluation.
- Revenue generation mechanisms and taxation policies.
- Allocation of funds to various sectors and programs.
- Public engagement and consultation in the budget process.
- Transparency and accountability measures.
- Case studies highlighting successful budgetary practices from developed democracies.

Develop an easy-to-understand kit on the budget making process, include examples from developed democracies. Ensure that the contents are accurate, up-to-date, and sourced from reputable academic and governmental institutions.
